Dear Gates Chili Middle School Families,

Welcome to the start of a new school year! This Family Handbook is a resource for you to reference throughout the school year.

The Gates Chili Middle School (GCMS) community has created an atmosphere where we teach and inspire excellence for all learners. This atmosphere flourishes because of the dedicated and accomplished staff, thoughtful and involved families, and positive and responsible students. It takes a commitment from all stakeholders to help reinforce the District core values of respect, responsibility, compassion, and hard work.

#### Creating a successful learning community...

According to the Association for Middle Level Education, there are 14 characteristics that, when fully implemented, create successful schools for young adolescents.

These characteristics are:

- Educators who value working with this age group and are prepared to do so;
- Courageous, collaborative leadership;
- A shared vision that guides decisions;
- An inviting, supportive, and safe environment;
- High expectations for every member of the learning community;
- Students and teachers engaged in active learning;
- An adult advocate for every student;
- School-initiated family and community partnerships;
- Curriculum that is relevant, challenging, integrative, and exploratory;
- Multiple learning and teaching approaches that respond to their diversity;
- Assessment and evaluation programs that promote quality learning;
- Organizational structures that support meaningful relationships and learning;
- School-wide efforts and policies that foster health, wellness, and safety;
- Multifaceted guidance and support services.

We embrace these characteristics; *therefore*, we proudly dedicate ourselves to being the best middle school level educators we can be.

#### **Learning Communities**

Gates Chili Middle School is divided into three 6th - 8th grade communities of learning: Amerks, Redwings, and Rhinos. For the most part, students remain in the same community throughout their middle school experience, resulting in a sustained relationship with the teachers who serve them. Parents also find it easier to talk to a common core of staff members.

Communities provide for the following:

- greater sense of belonging (closer relationships with teachers, who in turn, have a better understanding of their students' unique learning needs and interests)
- added convenience for students with many classes close to one another in a specific wing of the school
- reduction of student movement throughout the building, thereby creating additional time for instruction; increased number of interactions between your child and his/her teachers and peers within a community, while helping to reduce disciplinary issues.

Since these communities comprise one much larger school, GCMS students enjoy the best of both worlds, with school-wide theme weeks, clubs, socials, performing groups and athletic teams. GCMS students are mixed in several of their exploratory classes to enable new friendships and rekindle old ones with students who are assigned to any one of our separate communities. Providing optimal learning environments has been an essential goal of the school district. The creation of Middle School communities has helped us to take a significant step forward to this end.

#### **HOW ARE WE ACHIEVING OUR VISION?**

- Three communities spanning grades six through eight are in operation.
- We try to have students remain in the same community for the duration of their time at Gates Chili Middle School; However, this does not always happen.
- Communities are housed in separate wings of the building.
- Each community is assigned its own administrator and teams of English, math, science, and social studies teachers whose rooms are housed together in a common hallway.
- The location of the cafeteria, library, art, Family and Consumer Science (FACS), technology, and music wings remain common to all students.

#### How to Stay Connected with the Middle School

#### 1. Parent Portal

Available to Gates Chili Middle School families is a tool called the <u>Parent Portal</u>. Using a password protected program, you are afforded the opportunity to view your student's schedule, grades, discipline history, attendance, etc. Once school begins, the student's primary contact will be sent an e-mail with a code to the portal. Parent Portal provides access to your student's schedule, five-week progress reports, and quarterly report cards. Taking advantage of the continuous feedback provided by the portal will allow families the opportunity to converse more explicitly with their student about completed assignments and/or work that may be owed. It will also provide family members an opportunity to celebrate a student's success on individual school assessments and earlier warning if a student is in academic jeopardy.

#### 2. Schoology

The Gates Chili Central School District uses Schoology as its learning management system to help guide instruction in an online environment. Students can

#### Honors and Assessment

#### **ACADEMIC HONORS**

Gates Chili Middle School has three methods to recognize superior student achievement each quarter: Honor Roll, High Honor Roll, and Reach Roll. The criteria for each are as follows:

- *Honor Roll:* an overall quarterly average between 87.5% and 92.4%
- *High Honor Roll:* an overall quarterly average of 92.5% or higher
- **Reach Roll**: an overall increase in a quarterly average by 5 percentage points or more and no failing quarter grades

#### **ASSESSMENT**

Each year students in Grades 3-8 take the New York State tests in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Students in Grades 5 and 8 also take the New York State Science exam. The New York State testing program is designed to evaluate the implementation of the State's Learning Standards at the student, school, district, and state levels.

Testing plays an important role in education at every level. Data collected from State Assessments, unit tests and quizzes, and daily homework assignments is used by classroom teachers to inform them about their practice and your student's learning needs. Assessment information helps teachers plan their instruction and identify interventions necessary to support a student's academic success. The information gained from your student's participation in State Assessments is not used in isolation to determine program placement. The information is used in combination with classroom performance and teacher recommendation to identify the supports needed to help all students be successful.

Final exams will be administered to measure the academic growth of each student. The final exam scores will be posted on your child's report card and will be weighted 20% of the fourth quarter average.

#### Student Attendance

The district recognizes the importance of student attendance and will use a variety of methods to engage students in the learning process. Daily attendance tracking is recorded in the district's student management system, SchoolTool. Calls will be made to the families of students who are absent from school for the day.

#### **IMPORTANCE OF REGULAR ATTENDANCE**

Please remember to consult our District calendar when scheduling vacations, medical appointments, etc. We believe that education is important and that children learn best in school. Final examinations will be given on specific dates at specific times. As with NYS Regents Examinations, the Middle School cannot change final exam times. Your cooperation in supporting regular attendance is essential. Our Day A-D calendar indicates the school schedule.

#### **STUDENT ABSENCE:**

#### • Absence from School:

When your student is absent from school. **please call** the attendance office prior to 9:00 a.m. On the day your student returns to school, it is necessary to provide the Attendance Office <u>with a written note or e-mail</u> explaining the absence (585.247.5053). Written notification about the absence must be received within five school days of the absence or the absence will be marked as "truant."

#### • Late Arrival:

Should your student arrive late to school, call the attendance office with prior notice of the tardiness, or please be sure that the student enters the building with a note explaining the tardiness. Thank you!

#### • Early Dismissal:

If it is necessary for your student to leave school early, a note from home needs to be given to your student to take to the Attendance Office in the morning. For early dismissal, a student must be signed out by a parent/guardian.



#### Making up Work/Drop-off/Pick-up Location

#### MAKING UP SCHOOL WORK

- When a student absence occurs, it is essential that the student assumes the responsibility to catch up on lessons and make up missed assignments. Teachers and counselors will assist students in these efforts. Students who are absent may still find it possible to view the classwork in Schoology and work on completing it.
- In the beginning of the school year, encourage your student to identify a friend in each class to assist when they are absent. Students are encouraged to message teachers through Schoology or e-mail to obtain missed classwork.
- For any student absence of two days or more, you or your student can contact your student's community office to request work. Arrange to pick up the work 24 hours later. Please call the main office before your arrival to ensure that work is available. Pick-up of work is in the Main Office reception area.
- Upon returning from an absence, students should communicate with their teachers to formulate a plan for catching up on missed lessons.

#### **STUDENT DROP OFF - PICK UP**

All students are expected to be in their first period class at 7:58 am. If you are dropping a student off at school, please make sure you allow at least ten minutes for the student to unload from the car, enter the building, get breakfast, and walk to first period. Students who are in the building on time, but arrive to first period late, are marked late.

For the safety of our students, the Middle School bus loop will be closed daily from 7:30 a.m. – 8:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. All students being dropped off in the morning for the start of school and/or needing to be picked up at 2:57 p.m. <u>MUST</u> be dropped off and picked up at Door 19, which is in our south parking lot (facing Buffalo Road). No other location is acceptable because they are not supervised.

Before school, students being dropped off at Door #19 will not be permitted to enter the building until 7:35 a.m. Students must remain in the car until 7:35 a.m. Staff will be outside to assist with the drop off process to get everyone into the building and out of the parking lot safely. Be advised that due to an anticipated increased number of drop-offs/pick-ups this process will take longer than usual, as we start the school year. We ask for your patience.

Additionally, in the afternoon, to manage the buses and appropriately supervise our students, the only acceptable pick-up location is Door #19. If your student is not taking the bus home and you choose to pick them up, you need to arrive by 2:57 p.m.

Your student's safety is very important to us. Please help us to enforce these expectations by communicating them with your student and dropping off and picking up your student on time and at the appropriate location

#### **Activity Period/After School**

Students stay after school for many reasons. Students are encouraged to participate in extracurricular clubs and intramurals, as well as stay to get extra help from their teachers. These opportunities are offered during the Activity Period from 3:03 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Students must arrive on time for the Activity Period, or they will risk losing after-school privileges. This includes students who play on sports teams. The after-school time operates like a class period during the school day.

Students must have prior permission from the supervising teacher to stay after school. It is the student's responsibility to call home to let parents/guardians know they will be staying after. Students can use school phones to call home. Only students who have received prior permission from a teacher may stay after and receive transportation home. Students who stay after school, but do not have permission to stay after school will be assigned to the detention room until Activity Period ends and a parent/guardian will be contacted to pick up the student.

From time to time, special circumstances or situations can arise for students (for example, confusion about a date for a club meeting). Students can seek assistance from their community or the main office.

#### **WALKING HOME:**

Students may walk/bike ride off campus only if they have obtained a <u>WALKER'S/BIKE</u> <u>RIDER'S PASS</u> from his/her Community Administrator.

An application for a WALKER'S/BIKE RIDER'S PASS must be signed by a parent or guardian. The signature provides parent/guardian approval that the student may walk or ride a bike directly home. An application can be picked up in the Community Office. It needs to be completed, signed, and returned to the Community Office for administrator approval and processing of a pass for the student. This process may take a couple of days, so it is best to do this with advance notice of when you may need it. A pass may be written for the entire year or for a designated period of time. It is important to specify this on the application. Students who are caught walking or riding a bike home without this pass may be given a consequence.

#### Instructional Technology

All students within the district will be provided with a laptop for the school year. Instructional technology guidance and resources to students and parents/guardians are available on the district website at <a href="https://www.gateschili.org">https://www.gateschili.org</a>.

#### Progress Reports and Report Cards

A critical element of any student's learning experience is the need for timely and meaningful feedback. Three primary purposes for providing student progress reports and report cards are:

- 1. To communicate student growth to parents and the broader community.
- 2. To provide feedback to students for self-evaluation.
- 3. To document student progress and the effectiveness of instructional programs.

Staff provide an indication of student progress towards meeting course expectations and standards every five weeks. There are four quarters in the school year, each being approximately ten weeks. Quarter averages are provided in each course at the end of the ten-week period. These grades go on a child's permanent record. Additionally, we provide progress reports at the five-week point in each quarter. The purpose of progress reports is to provide you and your child with information that gives your child the opportunity to provide additional support, if necessary, in order to meet the expectations and standards for the quarter.

Report cards and progress reports are posted online through the Parent Portal. On the Parent Portal you can keep up to date on information such as schedules, quarterly grades, assignment grades, discipline reports, and attendance.

For your reference, the following are the posting dates for progress reports and report cards. These are subject to change. Please keep in mind that both reports will be available for viewing on-line and report cards will be mailed approximately one week after the posting date.

#### Code of Conduct and Character

#### **Dress Code:**

Students are responsible for wearing appropriate clothing to school. Clothing not allowed includes, *but not limited to*:

- Extremely brief, revealing, or see-through garments.
- Clothing that allows undergarments to be exposed
- Tops with large arm hole openings (exposing torso)
- Items of clothing with sexual, violent, or drug related references or innuendos
- Clothing attachments or accessories that could be considered to be weapons (for example, long chains or spiked jewelry)
- Pants that fall down and are not secured at the waist.
- Slippers
- Shirts without at least a strap
- Shirts exposing skin above the belly button



#### **Upstander Movement**

The Upstander movement is an ongoing and exciting process focused on transforming Gates Chili Middle School (GCMS) from a culture of student bystanders into a community where everyone is aware of the importance of taking a positive stand for all students. The initiative promotes student and staff involvement in school wide programs and activities. Bullying situations have been reduced and the social climate of our school has improved because of students taking action in a positive way to stand up for themselves and others.

Students and adults can work together to make Upstanders an important part of our school. The emphasis on the meaning of being an Upstander is a way to help our Spartan Way values of *Respect, Responsibility, Compassion and Hard Work* become that much more understandable and meaningful daily.

Upstanders are students or student groups that choose to take a positive stand on behalf of themselves and others. They are heroes and are responsible examples to others. Upstanders:

- · stand up for their beliefs, while respecting others.
- · do what they think is right, even if they stand alone.
- · are not simply bystanders; they act to interrupt bully behavior and/or support the target of bullying.
- · pay attention if something that is happening is wrong and do something to make things right.
- · show compassion toward others.

#### DASA: THE DIGNITY FOR ALL STUDENTS ACT

New York State passed the Dignity Act for All Students in 2012.

#### This act states that:

"No student shall be subjected to harassment by employees or students on school property or at a school function; nor shall any student be subjected to discrimination based on a person's actual or perceived race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender (including gender identity or expression), or sex by school employees or students on school property or at a school function."

# IVING THE SPARTAN WAY

#### School Safety and Emergency Procedures

#### LOCKED DOORS

To help ensure safety, all outside doors to the school are locked from the outside after students arrive in the morning. Please acknowledge this policy and do not open a door from the inside to admit anyone. Do not ask a student to let you in through a door. Visitors must use the front doors and immediately report to the office. We use a 2N intercom system at the Middle School. To gain access to the main office, you will need to press the button on the intercom. Someone will talk to you through the intercom to ask how they can help you and then buzz open the door if applicable.

#### PROPER IDENTIFICATION

Make sure you have photo identification (ID)!

If you are picking up a student, the scanning system will allow us to make sure the student is delivered to the correct individual(s). This is one more level of security that ensures our students are safe. If you are picking up your student, after verifying with your ID, we will have you wait in the vestibule while we call your student to the office for dismissal.

#### **EMERGENCY PROCEDURES**

To ensure the safety of students and staff, emergency drills are performed throughout the year. During a fire drill, students are evacuated from the building and gather on the school grounds until they are directed to return to the building. We also practice the following situations: Shelter-in-Place, Hold-in-Place, Lock-Out, Lock-Down, and Evacuation to a different location.

In a Shelter-In-Place, students and staff remain in their classroom/offices. Classes continue as normal, but there is no movement in the hallways. A Shelter in Place is typically called for the purpose of weather emergencies.

In a Hold-In-Place, students and staff remain in their classroom/offices. Classes continue as normal, but there is no movement in the hallways. A Hold in Place is typically called for the purpose of medical emergencies.

In a Lock Out, the school continues to operate under normal daily routines within the building but curtails outside activity and visitors.

In a Lock Down, students remain in one location with doors and windows locked and student movement within the building ceased immediately.

In an Evacuation to a different location, students and staff leave the building and go to a safe location.

#### **EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSINGS**

In the event of inclement weather or an emergency school closing, information will be immediately posted on our district website at www.gateschili.org. School closing information will be broadcast on our local radio and television stations. School closings should be announced by 6:00 a.m. In the event of an early dismissal, announcements will also be made on those stations. During an emergency, please do not call the school about closings unless it is absolutely critical. This ties up the phone lines and hampers communication for emergency services.

#### School Safety and Emergency Procedures

Since emergency situations cannot be predicted, it is essential to establish alternative plans. This is especially true during the pandemic when schools may be shut down with little notice. In helping you prepare alternative arrangements for your child's supervision and safety; the following steps are offered:

- Make arrangements with a neighbor or relative to take care of your student if you will not be home.
- Discuss and practice these procedures with your student to ensure they know where to go if an emergency school closing is required.



#### Support Services (Health Office and Counseling)

#### **HEALTH OFFICE**

- All seventh-grade students and every student new to the district will need to have a physical examination. This can be performed by the family physician or the school physician. Scoliosis screening for all students will be done in the nurse's office. Vision and hearing screening for all students new to the district and for all grade 7 students will take place. Parents will be notified of any test results which appear to need a follow-up.
- Any accident or injury occurring on school property must be reported to the health office by the injured person.
- If your child is seriously ill, or injured, or will be out more than three (3) days, the nurse should be contacted at 585.247.6780.
- Immunizations—All students need to be compliant with New York State immunization requirements in order to attend school.
- **Dispensing Medication**—State law requires the following if a student must take medication (prescription and/or over the counter) during school hours; There must be:
  - a written request from the doctor.
  - a written request from the parent/guardian.
  - medication in a labeled prescription bottle.
  - medication delivered to the health office by an adult. Unused medication should be picked up by an adult the last week of school. Medications not picked up will be discarded.

#### **COUNSELING SERVICES**

- The Middle School offers individual and group counseling to students.
- General counseling lessons are conducted in classroom settings. Topics may include tools for academic success, peer relationships, and self-esteem.
- Counselors plan with individual students to facilitate a smooth transition to the next grade level.

#### STEP - MCC Program

#### **Purpose:**

Gates Chili Middle School collaborates with Monroe Community College (MCC) to encourage and support students with interest in pursuing a career in science, technology, math, and licensed professions. We offer a Science Technology Entry Program (STEP), which is an academic enrichment program. STEP is funded through a grant by New York State Education Department. The intent of the grant is to increase the number of historically underrepresented and economically disadvantaged students prepared to enter college and to improve their participation rate in these fields of study. Admission into this program is competitive and requires students to participate in an application process.

#### Eligibility:

The eligibility requirements are:

- minimum overall average of 78%
- enrolled in grades 7 or 8

Students who are not underrepresented (e.g. Black/African American, Hispanic/Latino, Alaskan Native, or American Indian) must meet economically disadvantaged eligibility guidelines as established by NYS.

- Economically disadvantages; or
- Black/African American, Hispanic/Latino, Alaskan Native, or American Indian

- 3-week Summer Bridge Program that is free to STEP students.


