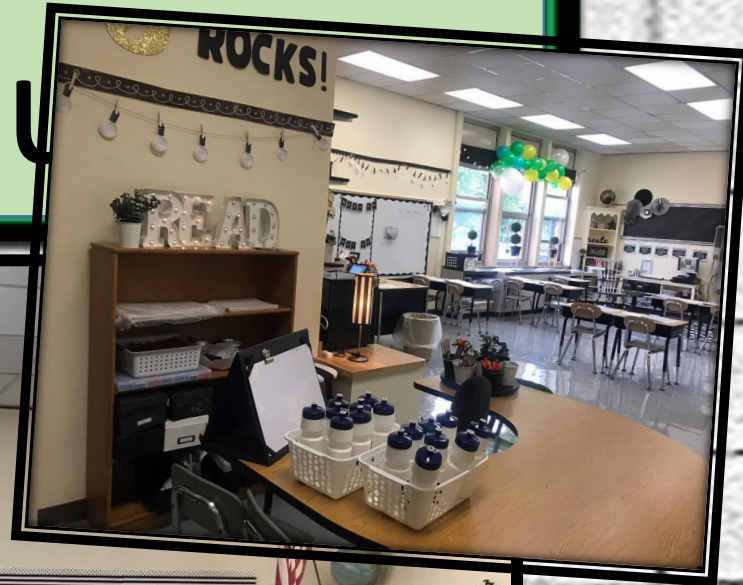

# Social Emotional Learning

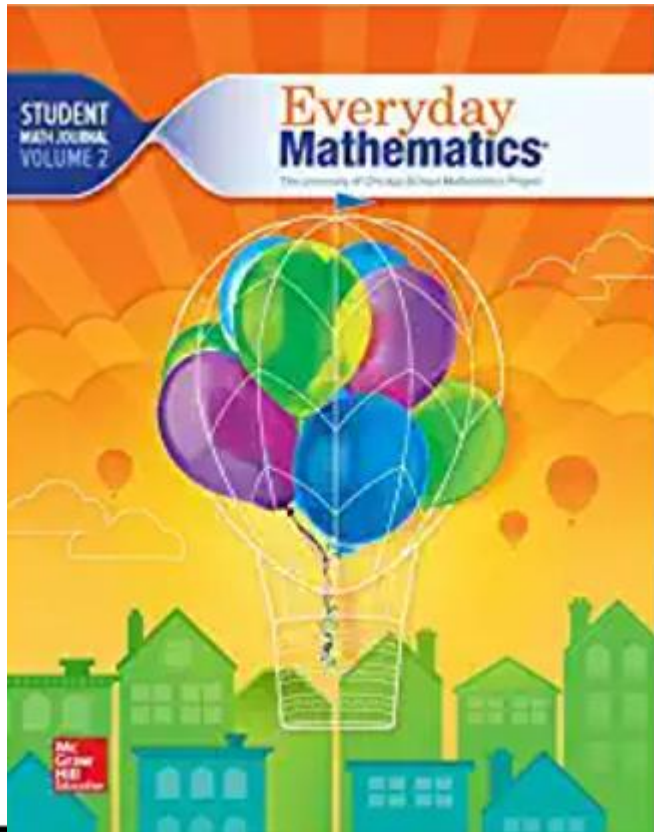
Throughout the year, Mrs. Abraham, school counselor, will teach SEL lessons in each 3<sup>rd</sup> grade class.

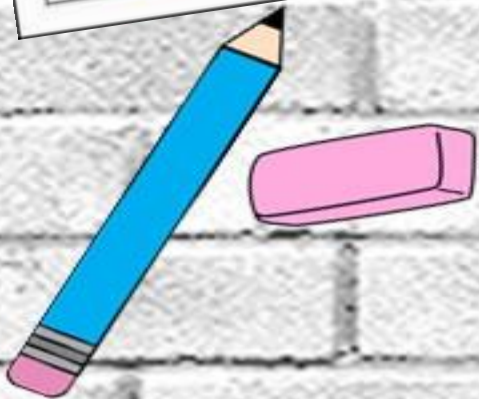

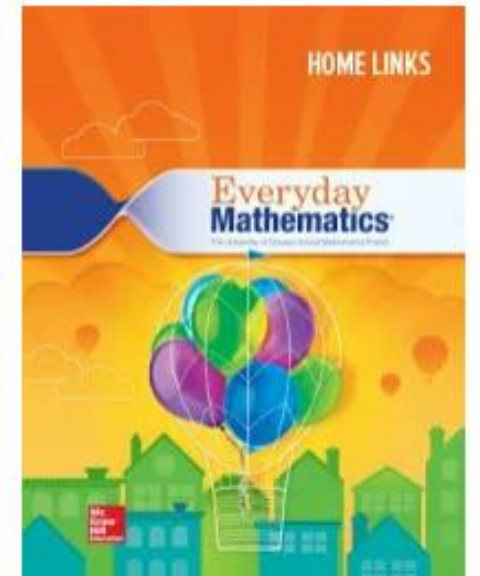
