


### **Calendar Activities**

### **ELA**

Students will participate in activities that will develop their reading and writing skills. This will be accomplished through a developmental approach to learning.

#### **Reading Instruction:**

- Letter names and letter sounds
- -Identifying beginning, middle, and ending sounds within words
- -Rhyming
- -Recognizing, reading, and writing high frequency words
- -Identifying parts of a book
- -Reading with a partner
- -Independent reading
- -Listening to reading
- -Remembering and retelling important details in stories
- -Working in literacy station rotations



## **Writing Instruction:**

- •Handwriting: learning correct letter formation for all upper and lowercase letters
- Learning to write their name the "school way"
- •Generate ideas for writing in narrative, informational, and opinion writing
- Sharing/writing through pictures and words
- Adding details to pictures
- •Stretching out sounds in words to write them
- •Write high frequency words conventional using a word wall

### Math

\*Students will participate in activities that will develop their mathematical thinking. This will be accomplished through a developmental approach to learning. Our math program is accomplished through a lot of concrete activities in small and large groups. (We have a new math program this year).



## **Second Step:**

Second Step is a classroom-based social skills program for children that teaches social emotional skills aimed at reducing impulsive and aggressive behavior while increasing social competence. The program builds on cognitive behavioral intervention models integrated with social learning theory, empathy research, and social information processing theories.



#### **Schoology Parent Access**

Parents have the option to create accounts in Schoology, which will allow access to your student's course content and assignments. There are two phases to creating your Schoology parent account. - 2. Login using your SchoolTool Parent Portal username and password
- Click on the student icon



4. Click on the User Defined Tab



The screen will refresh, and the Schoology access code will be listed (use the dropdown arrow and select Schoology if it does not appear after the screen refresh)



Repeat steps 3-5 if you have multiple students in the district. Each student will have a unique code. In Phase 2, you will need a separate access code for each student.



- Once you have registered, you'll be taken to the Parent View of Schoology. To switch to the Student View, simply click the down arrow next to your name and then select your child.

6. If you have multiple students in the district, each student will have a unique code, which is in the SchoolTool Parent Portal. To add another student in your Schoology parent account, click the arrow to the right of your name and select, "Add Child." From there, enter the next student code for the child you would like to add. Complete this step for each additional student you would like to add. Schoology will allow you to switch between your students.

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
