Congratulations Class of 2019!

Gates Chili High School added 321 graduates to its alumni as the Class of 2019. Students walked the stage on June 26 as hundreds of family members, friends and faculty proudly watched at the Rochester Institute of Technology Field House.

The event included performances by Gates Chili musical groups and speeches from the valedictorian and salutatorian.

Salutatorian Maya Charcholla reflected on the string of events that led the students to sharing their journeys together. She acknowledged that many parts of life have been decided for them, but now they are moving on and making their own choices.

"How are we supposed to decide what we want to do or where we want to go when we've never had a choice like this before?" said Charcholla. "Although it is scary, it is the one thing for certain that we have in common. We have no idea what we

Capital Project Update

The warmer weather has allowed for considerable progress on the Gates Chili CSD Capital Project. The bulk of the work has been happening at the Gates Chili High School work site, where contractors continue to make headway on the new Spartan Field. The stone base for the new track and the foundation for the second scoreboard are complete. Workers have completed the water-line for irrigation, turf anchors and stone have been laid, and turf installation is underway. Meanwhile, electricians are now busy pulling wire for the press box and lights.

Demolition has begun a few hundred yards away at Gates Chili Middle School. The pool has been filled and ongoing work includes leveling of the old pool deck and locker room floors.

The elementary schools are starting to see things come together. At Florence Brasser Elementary School, interior wall framing has finished up and drywall has begun to be hung. Electrical and plumbing rough-in is nearly complete and new windows have been installed. Meanwhile at Paul Road Elementary School, new playground equipment has been placed, and foundations for the new entryway are complete and demolition of the boys' locker room has wrapped up. Interior metal stud framing is in the works. Drywall and electrical/mechanical rough in are nearly finished.



The phase involving the Gates Chili High School auditorium will go out to bid in September and construction is expected to begin in January 2020. The entire project is scheduled to be completed in fall 2021. The latest developments can always be found on the Gates Chili website at www.gateschili.org/capitalproject.

First-ever GCHS students receive NYS Seal of Biliteracy

Fifteen members of the Gates Chili High School Class of 2019 are the first in school history to earn the NYS Seal of Biliteracy on their graduation diplomas. This prestigious designation means that students have attained a high level of proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing in one or more languages, in addition to English.

The intent of the NYSSB is to encourage the study of languages, identify high school graduates with language and biliteracy skills for employers and provide universities with additional information about applicants seeking admission. To earn the seal, students must meet criteria set by New York State as well as the district to prove language proficiency at the intermediate high level or above, as defined by the American Council on Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL).

"By learning a language, you gain not only another skill, but a deeper understanding of the culture," Merrill DiPonzio said. "Two seals of biliteracy looks great on a diploma and will certainly help in my future endeavors as an international relations major."

Several students were able to earn the seal for their knowledge of their native language and English.

"As an immigrant I see this Seal of Biliteracy as a badge of honor," said Eduard Kulazhonak. "Many from the immigrant community have forsaken their native language and culture, but being able to obtain the seal means that I still have

part of my native culture that I am able to contribute to the melting pot of this land."

In 2012, New York became the second state to offer a seal of biliteracy. This is the first year Gates Chili CSD has offered this diploma endorsement. In addition to the NYSSB, Gates Chili offers two other diploma endorsements, including career and technical education and business and finance.
