2024-2025 SCHOOL PROFILE

THE HIGH SCHOOL

Gates Chili High School is a comprehensive school offering an extensive and varied program, including 15 AP courses, 35 dual high school/college credit courses, and opportunities in career and technical education through the Board of Cooperative Educational Services. Graduation requirements include the completion of 22 credits.

THE SCHOOL DISTRICT

The independent school district covers an area of nineteen and a half square miles with a population of 34,589 Governed by a nine-person Board of Education, six schools serve a PreK-12 student population of 3,726 with an instructional staff of 460.

THE COMMUNITY

The Gates Chili Central School District serves the towns of Gates and Chili, the most immediate western suburbs of Rochester, New York. We are a middle socioeconomic community where most residents work as skilled technicians or professionals in the Greater Rochester area. Numerous colleges, universities, recreational and cultural activities are easily accessible.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The following credits are required for graduation:

4 English; 4 Social Studies; 3 Mathematics; 3 Science; .5 Health Education; .5 Career Exploration/Financial Literacy; 2 Physical Education; 1 Art/Music; 3 Electives and a minimum of 1 credit in a Foreign Language. A total of 22 credits are required for graduation.

GRADE REPORTING

Each quarter counts as one fourth of the final grade. ALL grades, including failures, appear on the transcript. Grades on report cards are not weighted. The official transcript indicates unweighted grades.

LATIN HONOR SYSTEM

The Gates Chili Central School District challenges its students to maximize their potential with an increased focus on expanding students' academic and intellectual risks. Beginning with the Gates Chili High School Class of 2025, students will have an opportunity to earn distinctions at graduation through a Latin honors system. Latin honor designation falls into three categories, each with its own minimum unweighted cumulative GPA requirement. Summa Cum Laude (with highest honor): 95.0-100.0 Magna Cum Laude (with great honor): 90.0-94.99 Cum Laude (with honor): 85.0-89.99

ACCREDITATION

Gates Chili High School is accredited by the New York State Board of Regents.
