With a touch device, this button will allow you to switch from desktop mode to tablet mode The little box to the right of the date and time will minimize all windows that are open and take you directly to your desktop

Touch Screen Features of Windows 10	 While using Windows 10 with a touch-screen device, you are able to toggle back and forth from Desktop Mode to Tablet Mode When you swipe from the left of the device towards the middle of the screen, the task view will appear showing all your open windows/programs: When you swipe from the right of the device towards the middle of the screen, the action center will appear showing you quick options, notifications, and settings: If you swipe from the top of your device towards the middle, you will make the window on your screen smaller or larger depending on the current size of it
